KNOW THE LAW

Find out which law determines the voting age in your country. Is it the constitution or an electoral law? Understanding this is the first step!



FIND THE DECISION-MAKERS



Who has the <u>power to change</u> that law? Is it being decided in a parliamentary committee, a ministry, or the governing party / parties? Knowing this helps you target the right people!



MAKE THE CASE FOR





Show why the current voting age isn't working!
Consult the Youth Forum's webpage on lowering the voting age¹ to back up your arguments.

USE THESE TOP THREE ARGUMENTS

- Improving young people's trust in democracy, means getting more voices in the democratic process.
- Making voting a lifelong habit by starting at school.
- Voting for the first time as a shared social experience, not as an individual experience, means that people are more likely to continue voting later on in life.



DEBUNK THE MYTH

There's people who are proving tricky to convince, the ones that often say that 16-year-olds are not mature enough to vote. Here's how to respond: **16-year-olds are already active in their societies and make big decisions** about their lives, education, and careers - they're ready to vote too!







ENGAGE YOUR MP

Write to your local member of parliament asking for the law to change. A simple, direct letter can make a huge difference!

BE STRATEGIC

INVOLVE POLITICAL PARTIES

Invite the political parties in your country to a meeting and ask them to commit to voting at 16 in their election manifestos and / or their party programmes.
